<u>First Holy Communion:</u> In a currently combined parishes group 12 children who started their preparation this year will be continuing their course online this Sunday 7th Feb. starting at 10.05am and finishing at 10.40am so as to enable the families to attend either parish Mass on Sunday should they wish too. <u>Ash Wednesday:</u> This year is on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> February there will be the now usual 6.30pm Mass at English Martyrs and also an additional 10am Mass at St Augustine's. The Vatican has approved a covid-19 safe way of distributing ashes which is by sprinkling them over the head and only saying the words once before they are distributed.

Parish Sycamore Lent Retreat: This 'online retreat' on the six Tuesdays in Lent, for an hour, is aimed at those who wish to renew their faith during this holy season. The focus of these sessions is on knowing God and the salvation he offers in Jesus Christ, and on our response to this offer of salvation in faith, freedom and love.
